

Steps for K-12 Student/Parent Access to SUSD Online DAP Reports in Galileo

1. Go to the ATI home page by clicking on www.ati-online.com.
2. Once at the ATI homepage, click on Click on **K-12 Student/Parent Center**.
3. Type in your students' Galileo **Login Name** (their 6 digit student ID number) and **Password** (8 digit birth date) used for online testing. Click on Login.
4. Click on **View Grades**. At this time, parents can view their own child's grades for Benchmark assessments posted in the Student Center. Actual Benchmark assessments are only observable to students and district staff at the time of assessment.
5. The **Grades** window will appear with "**View test report**" already marked.

Selecting the View/Print Report will allow you to access the Individual Student Profile report that provides you the results of the Benchmark. A window displaying the student's Benchmark results on an **Individual Development Profile** will appear (This may take up to a minute). Note that Adobe Acrobat Reader is required to view this report and can be downloaded for free via the Internet.

The Individual Development Profile will provide you the Arizona Academic Standards (e.g., S1C1) and specifically the Essential Performance Objectives (e.g., M07-S1C1-02) on the right hand side of the report. This information will help you determine the skills that are being taught and assessed each quarter. The Individual Development Profile also displays the Performance Levels reached by Performance Objective on the Benchmark Assessment on the left hand side. The District has chosen similar performance descriptors as the AIMS test so that students and parents become familiar with this type of reporting.

The following scale is used to determine your child's performance on each quarterly assessment:

<u>Performance Level</u>	<u>Percentage Correct</u>
Exceeds Standards	93-100
Meets Standards	80-92
Approaching Standards	60-79
Below Standards	40-59
Fall Far Below Standards	0-39

These score ranges are based on the decision to assess each performance objective with five items in order to determine the accuracy of the data (also known as reliability and validity). You'll notice that we developed a mid-range performance level (Below Standard) to help further identify/differentiate student performance below Meets Standards (passing). These data should be used to help assist students with any necessary remediation, reteaching or enrichment identified based on the benchmarks results. Parents are encouraged to communicate with teachers about ways in which they can assist the school in building upon your student's successes.

6. By selecting the "View test scores" option you will be able to see the results by the number of Total Points the student received for each Benchmark Assessment for a particular scale (e.g., 3rd Grade Language Arts – Test 1).

The window will show the **Maximum points** attainable for the Benchmark.
The window will show the **Score** (percent out of 100) obtained by the student.
